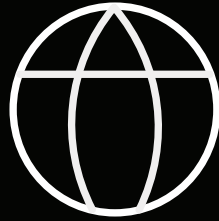


# Hello and Welcome to the Anarchist Federation of Cyber Communes



## 1) What is this?

This is a place to unite. To come together to figure out how to build a better world, and to start building it. Share skills, pitch projects, exchange ideas, and so on.

## 2) What is a cyber commune?

For practical purposes, you can think of a commune as a project, a collective, a gathering space, an affinity group, or whatever works for your needs and/or purposes.

We use the term cyber because we primarily operate on the internet, but also because each commune conceptually operates as a cybernetic entity.

We refer the reader to our internal documents for a more theoretical treatment of the cyber commune.
